On every working day, they deliver more than 130,000 lunch boxes - all while battling traffic and crowds in the world's third most populated city. They have created a benchmark for logistical efficiency and are widely known for their error-free services. (The rate of error of the dabbawallas in Mumbai is1 in 16 million deliveries.) They barely use any technological devices and are commendable and punctual in their work.
